SEACOAST REGION

1. Odiorne's Point

This is the site of the first settlement in NH and it was originally called Pannaway Plantation. During World War II this site was converted to an old Army Fort.

2. Strawberry Banke

This is one of America's oldest settlements. It is located in Portsmouth and contains 42 old houses from the seventeenth to the nineteenth centuries.

3. Bound Rock

Capt. Nicholas Shapley marked this historical rock AD 1657. This marker was the boundary between Hampton and Salisbury, MA.

4. Josiah Bartlett

(1729-1795) Bartlett was a signer of the Declaration of Independence and the Articles of the Confederation. He was also New Hampshire's first Governor.

5. Exeter Town House

On January 5, 1776, the first state constitution was signed establishing an independent state government, the first of the thirteen colonies.

6. Atlantic Cable Station and Sunken Forest

In the town of Rye along the coast is where they located the first Atlantic Cable. This cable was used to send the first message across an ocean.
